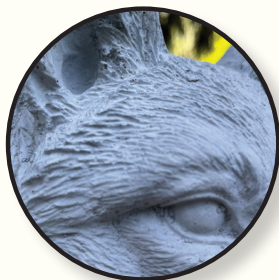

WHO'S THAT MAMMAL?

Gray Wolf

These large carnivores used to live across 2/3 of the U.S. Now, due to overhunting, populations are only found in 7 western states.

White-tailed Deer

Pennsylvania's deer population ranks within the top 10 in the country: there are over one million deer within the state.

Red Fox

Red foxes are the most widespread meat-eating mammal on the planet. Their hearing is so sensitive that they can hear rodents digging miles underground.

Eastern Cottontail

As small herbivores, rabbits must be athletic to escape predators. They can run at speeds up to 15mph and can jump as far as 15 feet.

Black Bear

These omnivores will eat almost anything. Their large appetites and intelligence allow them to identify food by scent and by its appearance.
